Kerbal Space Program (KSP) is widely played by NASA employees, though it is used primarily for public outreach, education, and recreation rather than as a primary professional engineering tool.

Use by NASA Employees

Recreational Play: Many NASA engineers and scientists play KSP in their free time because it captures the "spirit" of their work with high fidelity.

Professional Inspiration: Some current NASA employees, such as spacecraft navigation analysts, credit playing KSP during their education as a major influence on their career choice.

Zero-G Indicators: In May 2022, a Kerbal plush was used as the zero-gravity indicator on the Boeing Starliner's second orbital test flight to the International Space Station.
