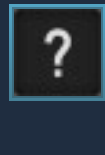

IMHO what made KSP be choosen is not about how close it is from Real Life™ (because it's not that close - Microsoft Space Simulator is way more realistic than it). It's due how incredibly easy is to build your ideas, sometimes by expanding the game itself. MS SpaceSim is just not expandable at all, and in Orbiter you need to be a developer to create new crafts - but at least you could tie the existing ones together in stages using Velcro Rockets.

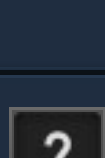
So don't get involved, good bye! 🎉
